Highlighting Siegwerk's commitment to this issue, Oliver Waddington, Global Lead for Functional Paper Coatings at Siegwerk, will deliver a keynote speech titled "Alternatives to PFAS in fiber-based Packaging" on the first day of the summit. "Our expanding market presence inspires us to pursue even greater challenges," said Waddington. "Siegwerk's recent acquisition of Allinova represents a significant milestone, enhancing our ability to serve customers with proven solutions while boosting our capacity to innovate advanced,

sustainable coatings.”
